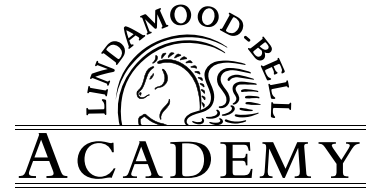


Academy Magic Newsletter

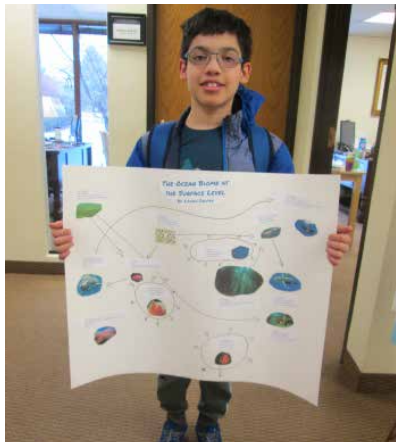

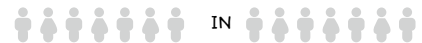
Good To Know
