

In the spirit of giving thanks, I wanted to take a moment to really think about my time working with a specific family. Today, a mom shared with me that she and dad have noticed a big difference in Brian's communication in the last week. He is more talkative and more conversational, using full sentences. Including for the first time ever, starting a conversation in a much more age appropriate way. While reading a book at lunch time, he offered up information he'd just read about the emperor penguin and asked what Joe thought, rather than just repeating a phrase or word to start an exchange.

Brian is one of my favorite students to be around. He is thoughtful and clever and observant. When I came back after not seeing him for a few years, he still remembered old motivators I had made,

conversations we'd had and has greeted me everyday since with a very enthusiastic "Xenia"! Joe is expressive, social and enthusiastic. He treasures his unique connections with each clinician, tells me stories about his memories of me from years ago, and has evolved to calling me "Xen Xen" when he thinks being cute will get him out of session (it won't).

I really believe they've changed my life similar to the way that Lindamood-Bell has changed theirs. I have learned so much from Brian and Joe over the years. They've made me better at my job. I learned to listen, pay attention, be patient and creative in response to the unknown. I learned to take a kind of wonder and awe into how we do our work with our students. While Brian and Joe's path isn't always clear, we are on that path together and it is an adventure.

I am lucky to work with them.


