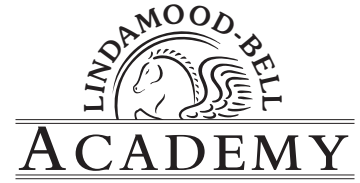


Academy Magic *Newsletter*

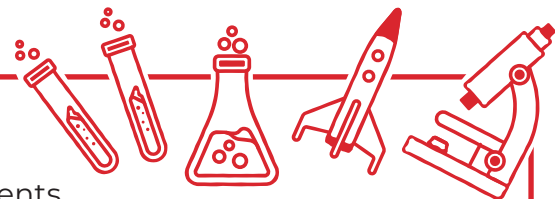

We watched him fall further and further behind and felt completely at a loss as to how to help him.

When COVID struck, we noticed that accessing school online might just be the answer. We researched possible programs

and discovered Lindamood-Bell.

It has been a game-changer. We have watched him grow as a student while steadily progressing in reading. He has made more gains in the last year than he had in the five years prior.
