**Atlanta's students had a blast** doing a winter sports-themed STEM project and experiment in January! They crafted "skiers" and "snowboarders" out of foil and popsicle sticks and learned about friction, gravity, and wind resistance. They experimented with



three different surfaces (clear contact paper, waxed paper, and report covers) to test the friction for the slope. The students then used the report cover sliders to craft a jump. One of the "snowboarders" even got airborne!
