
Philadelphia's "Bob Ross Invitational!"

STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

Author Extraordinaire, Braulio in Berkeley!

Our goals for Braulio's Narrative Writing Portfolio were many. Our main purpose was to expose Braulio to the creative writing process from the beginning to publishing a final copy of his story. Other goals included strengthening figurative language, visualizing a complete story, and exposure to the editing process. A bonus goal was to have lots of fun!

Braulio started the process by brainstorming an idea for a story and having his clinicians write those ideas down. Then he actively searched for pictures to support the flow of his narrative and put them into a jam board in the order of events. After dictating what he wanted his characters to be like, the writing began. Braulio stayed true to his original storyboard and fully dictated the plot and events in the story. After the rough draft was returned with feedback, Braulio, with the aide of the Berkeley team, looked for ways to strengthen the narrative, including reading the story aloud. He included everyone in finding spelling, grammar, and tense problems to fix the story. After completing the editing and revising steps, Braulio wanted to add pictures to help the reader see his story. He enlisted his team to do safe searches when he provided keywords, then added those photos to his story.

Through the process, Braulio learned about using figurative language and dialogue, became familiar with all steps of the creative process, and was the leader in creating an entertaining story. The Berkeley team is incredibly proud of his work and will be showing him off at his very own Meet the Author and Book Signing party!


