
This packet includes activities for two popular children's books, a few general topics, three Imagine That! Stories, and journaling activities. You can read the stories just for fun or as part of the Visualizing and Verbalizing® (V/V®) program, which develops language comprehension through imagery. The two popular books are upper elementary reading levels (3rd-6th grade). You should find these books at your local library or bookstore. The Imagine That! stories are written at a 3rd to 6th grade level, but you can use them with other grade levels as needed.


Each week includes vocabulary, activities, and prompts for your student. You can do activities on the days indicated, or move them around to match the student's pace of reading. There are eleven weeks of fun and learning in the packet. While talking about the books and stories with your student, be sure to ask imagery questions to elicit detailed imagery. The Imagine That! stories have higher order thinking questions. These include main idea, inference, conclusion, evaluation, and prediction to develop your student's critical thinking skills.






Tomb Raiders Go High Tech






